

Secure licensing by 2026 and enrol 200 children annually by 2028.

Create a Multipurpose Community Centre Featuring Recreational and Mental Health Facilities

Finalise designs and secure partnerships by 2028.



Develop Affordable Housing Initiatives

Register as Tier 3 Community Housing Provider by 2026.



Deliver Workshops On Digital Literacy, Physical Health, Women's Empowerment, And Cybersecurity

Conduct 50 workshops annually by 2027.




Launch Counselling Services and Expand Mental Health Programs
